3. Concept and Purpose of a MiPAL

Completion of the electronic Protocol Analyte List (or the MiPAL) is one of the first steps and main activities that will be required as part of your site's Laboratory Approval process. A completed MiPAL is a regulatory document that is approved by DAIDS and the Laboratory Center and indicates the site's plan for where and how all study-required testing will be done. This includes an approved backup testing plan to ensure continuity, should the Primary lab be unable to perform the required testing during the course of the study. Additionally, the PAL lists all of the study-required stored specimens and any centralized specialty lab testing.
